

# dinosaurs!

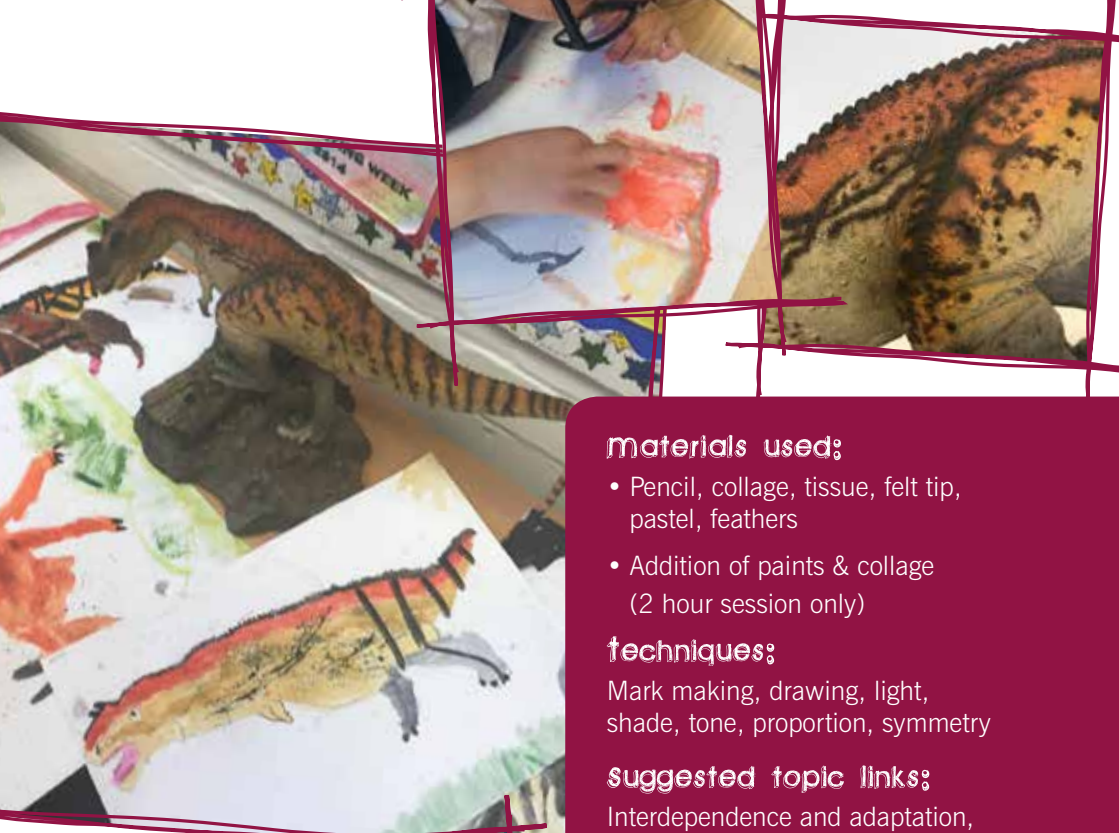
This session looks at dinosaurs and uses large scale, tactile models which inspire ideas about dinosaurs' skin texture and what they might have looked like.

Pupils will be shown how to draw dinosaurs or provided with a pre-drawn outline.

There is little evidence of what colour dinosaurs might have been and recent evidence suggests that they may even have had feathers.

Pupils are asked to imagine how they think dinosaurs may have looked and asked to add colours, skin textures, scales, fur, patterns and feathers to their drawing using the range of different materials provided!





### Materials used:

- Pencil, collage, tissue, felt tip, pastel, feathers
- Addition of paints & collage (2 hour session only)

### Techniques:

Mark making, drawing, light, shade, tone, proportion, symmetry

### Suggested topic links:

Interdependence and adaptation, evolution and inheritance

### Suitable for:

KS1/KS2
